

What is Indiana COPS

Indiana Concerns of Police Survivors (C.O.P.S) is a non-profit organization that assists law enforcement agencies with developing workable plans for handling survivors during the trauma affiliated with the sudden loss of a loved one in the line of duty. Annually, between 140 and 160 officers are killed in the line of duty. These tragic deaths leave the families and co-workers of fallen officers searching for ways to cope with their tragic losses. Nationally, C.O.P.S works with more than 30,000 survivors to provide the resources and partnership necessary to rebuild their shattered lives. The organization has around 50 chapters nationwide dedicated to serving its members on a local, grassroots level. Some of the emotional support and tangible resources members can receive through C.O.P.S include:

- Peer support at the national, state, and local levels;
- Retreats for spouses, parents, siblings, children, in-laws and co-workers;
- COPSkids counseling program;
- COPSkids summer camp;
- COPSTeens Outward Bound experience for young adults;
- Admittance to the National Police Survivors' Conference;
- Scholarships;
- Trial and parole support;
- and ● Additional assistance programs. These opportunities allow survivors to receive support targeted to their situation, surrounded by peers who understand the challenges they are facing.
